All children say these things from time to time. Although comments like these usually reflect normal growing pains. In some cases, however, children say these things on a regular basis. If that's true for your child, he/she may be communicating a need for help.

Feeling alone and disconnected from peers is a distressing thing for a child to experience. Good social skills enable children to get along well with others. Unfortunately, children rarely have opportunities to learn good social skills. Cooperation, empathy, conflict resolution, managing emotions, and listening skills are not commonly taught in our schools.

Teaching children basic social skills not only enables them to make and keep friends more easily, it gives the children a feeling of acceptance and a sense that they're not alone in their troubles. It also helps significantly improve their self-esteem. Social skills groups can help!
